Another Pixie Purrfect Pattern

Christmas Santa Hat Pattern



Here is the PixieKitten Free Pattern for the most recognizable Santa Hat. This Santa Hat can be used to decorate dolls, Rubber Duckie's, or Teddy Bears. Or you can just hang it on your Christmas tree.

This lovely little hat could be used on your Christmas Dinner table to hold a place card.

Cover the pom-pom and white fuzzy edging with glitter for a more festive look.

YOU WILL NEED

- 3.5mm (E/4) Crochet Hook
- Color A: Paton's Astra in Cardinal (CA)
- Color B: Paton's Astra in White (CB)
- Finishing Brushes for brushing the completed parts and making fur.
- Glitter – optional
- Sequins -optional
- Glue: Unique Hi Tak (dries clear)
- Stitch Marker or contrasting yarn to mark rows
- Stuffing: Fiberfill or desired stuffing material
- Hemostat or other stuffing tool
- Wool Needle or Large Tapestry Needle for sewing the pieces together.
- Scissors
- Size: 3.5" tall and 2.5" wide at base.

ABBREVIATIONS

CA = Color A

CB = Color B

ch = chain

dc = double crochet (UK treble crochet)

hdc = half double crochet

MC = Magic Circle

mm = millimeter(s)

p/u = pick-up

sc = single crochet (UK double crochet)

sc2tog = single crochet 2 stitches
together (decrease)

sk = skip

sl st = slip stitch (UK single crochet)

st = stitch(es)

STITCHES USED

Single Crochet (sc) = Insert hook in stitch, yarn over hook and pull through (2 loops on hook). Yarn over and pull through 2 loops.

Single Crochet 2 together (sc2tog) = Insert hook in stitch, yarn over hook and pull through and insert hook in next st, yarn over and pull through (3 loops on hook). Yarn over and pull through all 3 loops. **(Decrease 1 stitch)**

Magic Circle (MC) or Adjustable Ring = Wrap yarn around 3 fingers making a loop with the loose end under the working yarn, with hook reach under the loose yarn (above where the yarns cross) and pull the working yarn through and chain 1 stitch (1 loop on hook). Working around the yarn held by the chain stitch, single crochet the number of stitches called for in the pattern. For an MC of 6, you would crochet 6 single crochet stitches around the starting loop. Then pull the loose end of the yarn tight and you have made your Magic Circle.

NOTES

Do not join rounds unless otherwise indicated.

Use a yarn marker or contrasting yarn to mark rows.

Keep crochet stitches close together so the stuffing will not show when brushed.

The number in brackets (#) at the end of the row is the number of stitches you should have in that row.

PATTERN DIRECTIONS

HAT (Using 3.5mm hook)

1. In CA, MC of 3 or (Ch 2 and in 2nd ch from hook 3 sc in st) (3)
2. 1 sc in each st (3)
3. 2 sc in each st. (6)
4. *1 sc in st, 2 sc in st* repeat from * to * around. (9)
5. 1 sc in each st. (9)
6. *1 sc in 2 st, 2 sc in st* repeat from * to * around. (12)
7. 1 sc in each st. (12)
8. *1 sc in 3 st, 2 sc in st* repeat from * to * around. (16)
9. 1 sc in each st. (16)
10. 1 sc in each st. (16)
11. *1 sc in 3 st, 2 sc in st* repeat from * to * around. (20)
12. 1 sc in each st. (20)
13. 1 sc in each st. (20)
14. *1 sc in 4 st, 2 sc in st* repeat from * to * around. (24)
15. In CB, 1 sc in each st. (24)
16. *1 sc in st, 2 sc in st* repeat from * to * around. (38)
17. 1 sc in each st. (38)

18. *1 sc in st, sc2tog* repeat from * to * around. (24)
19. 1 sc in each st. (12) and fasten off with long tail for sewing pieces together. Brush the white part till it's fluffy



POMPOM

With a piece of cardboard 3/4" wide, wrap white yarn around about 10 times. Slide off the cardboard gently and tie a piece of yarn around the center and knot tightly. Cut loops at ends and brush out. Sew to the point of the Santa Hat. Bend over and stitch in place or leave straight.

ASSEMBLING:

There really is not a lot to the assembly, as most of the hat and edging are done in one piece.

Attaching the Pom-pom, using an extra piece of CB yarn, sew the Pom-pom in place.

Now you are ready to display your Santa Hat on an animal or just hang it on your Christmas Tree.
