Another Pixie Purrfect Pattern

eeek! Pattern



This is a PixieKitten free pattern and an amusing Halloween decoration.

It has a little Ghostie along with the letters. Make more than one as a decoration for home or office.

eeek! can be setup in a different configuration just use your imagination. It stands six inches tall and eight and a half inches wide.

YOU WILL NEED

- 3.5mm (E/4) Crochet Hook
- Color A: Bernat Chunky in Berry Red(CA)
- Color B: Bernat Super Value in White (CB)
- PixieKitten Sparkle Animal Eyes (6.0mm) - Solid Black (Safety Eyes)
- Details: Black Embroidery Floss
- Stitch Marker or contrasting yarn to mark rows
- Stuffing: Fiberfill or desired stuffing material
- Hemostat or other stuffing tool
- Wool Needle or Large Tapestry Needle for sewing the pieces together.
- Scissors
- Size: 6" tall and 8.5" nose to tail.

ABBREVIATIONS

CA = Color A

CB = Color B

ch = chain

dc = double crochet (UK treble crochet)

hdc = half double crochet

MC = Magic Circle

mm = millimeter(s)

p/u = pick-up

sc = single crochet (UK double crochet)

sc2tog = single crochet 2 stitches
together (decrease)

sk = skip

sl st = slip stitch (UK single crochet)

st = stitch(es)

STITCHES USED

Single Crochet (sc) = Insert hook in stitch, yarn over hook and pull through (2 loops on hook). Yarn over and pull through 2 loops.

Half Double Crochet (hdc) = Yarn over hook and insert hook into stitch, yarn over hook and pull through. (3 loops on hook) Yarn over and pull through all 3 loops.

Double Crochet (dc) = Yarn over hook and insert hook into stitch, yarn over hook and pull through 2 loops. (2 loops on hook) Yarn over and pull through 2 loops.

Single Crochet 2 together (sc2tog) = Insert hook in stitch, yarn over hook and pull through and insert hook in next st, yarn over and pull through (3 loops on hook). Yarn over and pull through all 3 loops. (**Decrease 1 stitch**)

Magic Circle (MC) or Adjustable Ring = Wrap yarn around 3 fingers making a loop with the loose end under the working yarn, with hook reach under the loose yarn (above where the yarns cross) and pull the working yarn through and chain 1 stitch (1 loop on hook). Working around the yarn held by the chain stitch, single crochet the number of stitches called for in the pattern. For an MC of 6, you would crochet 6 single crochet stitches around the starting loop. Then pull the loose end of the yarn tight and you have made your Magic Circle.

NOTES

Do not join rounds unless otherwise indicated.

Use a yarn marker or contrasting yarn to mark rows.

Stuff firmly so that each piece will hold its shape and stand up.

Keep crochet stitches close together so the stuffing will not show when brushed.

The number in brackets (#) at the end of the row is the number of stitches you should have in that row.

PATTERN DIRECTIONS

“e” (Using 3.5mm hook) (Make 2)

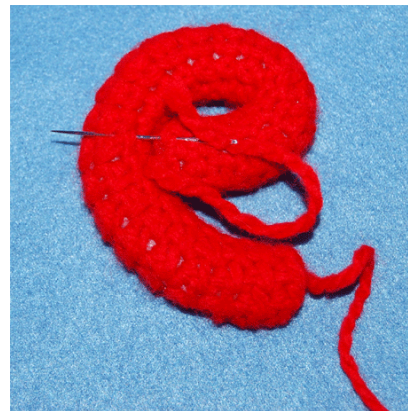
1. In CA, MC of 4 or (Ch 2 and in second from hook, 4 sc in st) (4)
2. 2 sc in each st. (8)
- 3-24. 1 sc in 2 st, 1 hdc in 4 st, 1 sc in 2 st. (8) [Stuff as you go](#).
25. 1 sc in 2 st, 1 hdc in 4 st, 1 sc in 2 st, (8) and fasten off with long tail for sewing pieces together.

Assembling the “e”:

Stuff the tube of the “e” firmly, so that it keeps its shape.

Shape the tube of the letter “e” as you stuff and stuff with fiberfill each 7 to 10 rounds.

The hdc on the outer side of the “e” will start to bend the crocheted tube into the shape of the “e” but as you stuff encourage the curve with your fingers. You may need to untwist the crocheted tube as it may twist as you crochet. To complete the “e”, stitch one end to middle of the tube to shape the letter “e”. Then weave in the tail.



“k” (Using 3.5mm hook)

Base:

1. In CA, MC of 4 or (Ch 2 and in second ch from hook, 4 sc in st) (4)
2. 2 sc in each st (8)
- 3-20. 1 sc in each st (8) [Stuff as you go](#)
21. *Sc2tog* repeat from * to * around (4) and fasten off with long tail for closing end.

Upstroke

1. In CA, MC of 4 or (Ch 2 and in second ch from hook, 4 sc in st) (4)
2. 2 sc in each st (8)
- 3-12. 1 sc in each st (8) [Stuff as you go](#)
13. Ch 1 to turn, 1 sc in 4 st, (4) [*Partial row for shaping*](#) and fasten off with long tail for closing end.

Downstroke

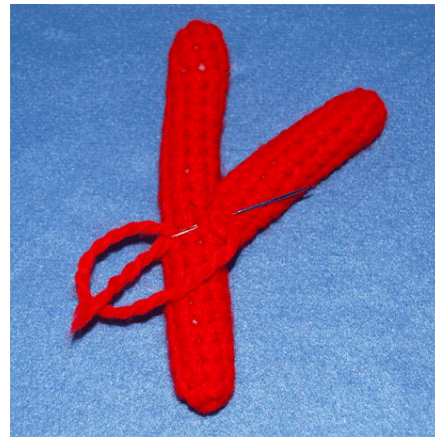
1. In CA, MC of 4 or (Ch 2 and in second ch from hook, 4 sc in st) (4)
2. 2 sc in each st (8)
- 3-10. 1 sc in each st (8) [Stuff as you go](#)
11. 1 sc in each st (8) and fasten off with long tail for closing end.

Assembling the “k”:

Stuff the Base tube of the “k” firmly, so that it keeps its shape and it has to hold up the other parts of the letter “k”.

Keep the shape of the tubes of the letter “k” very straight as you stuff and stuff the tube with fiberfill each 7 to 10 rounds. You may need to untwist the crocheted tube as it may twist as you crochet.

Attach the upstroke of the “k” to the long straight piece (two inches from the bottom of the “k”) and with the pointy end of the upstroke to the bottom. Using the tail, sew all the way around the edges of the upstroke making sure that you stuff extra fiberfill in to keep it stuffed firm.



Attach the downstroke of the “k” to the upstroke, keeping the center of the downstroke tube at one inch from the long straight part. Using the tail, sew all the way around the top of the downstroke.



Now, your “k” is finished.

“l” (Using 3.5mm hook)

Top:

1. In CA, MC of 4 or (Ch 2 and in second ch from hook, 4 sc in st) (4)
2. 2 sc in each st (8)
- 3-13. 1 sc in each st (8) [Stuff as you go](#)
14. *Sc2tog* repeat from * to * around (4) and fasten off with long tail for closing end.

Ball:

1. In CA, MC of 4 or (Ch 2 and in second ch from hook, 4 sc in st) (4)
2. 2 sc in each st (8)
3. 1 sc in each st (8)
4. *Sc2tog* repeat from * to * around (4) and fasten off with long tail for closing end.

Assembling the “!”:

Stuff the top tube of the “!” firmly, so that it keeps its shape. Stuff with fiberfill each 7 to 10 rounds.

Stuff the ball of the “!” firmly.

Attach the top of the “!”, 1/2 an inch from the top of the tube, sew it to the end of the upstroke of the “k”, and sew it firmly in place as this is all the top of the “!” is attached to. Sew the Ball to the end of the downstroke of the “k”, make sure it is firmly attached.

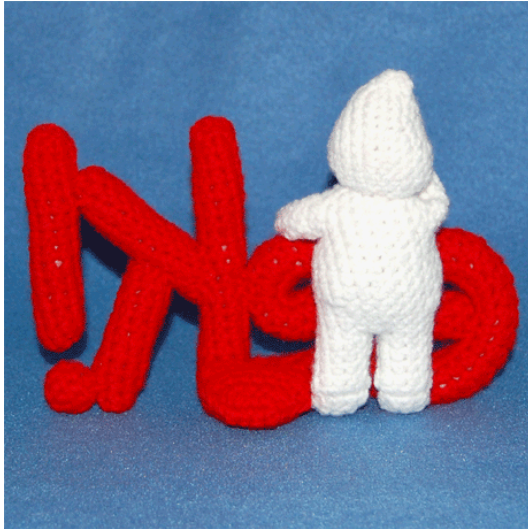
GHOSTIE**HEAD** (Using 3.5mm hook) (starting at the top of the Head)

1. In CB, Ch 2 and in second ch from hook, 2 sc in st, ch 1 to turn (2)
2. 2 sc in 2 st, and connect to first sc (to make a loop.) (4)
3. *1 sc in st, 2 sc in st* repeat from * to * around. (6)
4. 2 sc in each st. (12)
5. 1 sc in 5 st, 2 sc in st, 1 sc in 5 st, 2 sc in st. (14)
6. 1 sc in each st. (14)
7. 1 sc in 5 st, 2 sc in 2 st, 1 sc in 5 st, 2 sc in 2 st. (18)
8. 1 sc in each st. (18)
9. 1 sc in 5 st, 2 sc in 2 st, 1 sc in 7 st, 2 sc in 2 st, 1 sc in 2 st. (22)
- 10-11. 1 sc in each st. (22) [Insert Eyes before the opening gets too small.](#)
12. 1 sc in 5 st, sc2tog (twice), 1 sc in 7 st, sc2tog (twice), 1 sc in 2 st. (18)
13. *1 sc in st, sc2tog* repeat from * to * around. (12) [Stuff the head.](#)
14. 1 sc in st, sc2tog (twice), 1 sc in 3 st, sc2tog (twice) (8) and fasten off with long tail for sewing pieces together.

BODY (Using 3.5mm hook) (Starting at shoulders)

1. In CB, MC of 6 or (Ch 2 and in second ch from hook 6 sc in st) (6)
2. 2 sc in each st. (12)
3. 1 sc in 2 st, 2 sc in 2 st, 1 sc in 4 st, 2 sc in 2 st, 1 sc in 2 st. (16)
4. 1 sc in 3 st, 2 sc in 2 st, 1 sc in 6 st, 2 sc in 2 st, 1 sc in 3 st. (20)
5. 1 sc in 4 st, 2 sc in 2 st, 1 sc in 8 st, 2 sc in 2 st, 1 sc in 4 st. (24)
6. 1 sc in 5 st, ch 2, sk 4, 1 sc in 8 st, ch 2, sk 4, 1 sc in 3 st. (20)
7. 1 sc in each st. (20)
8. 1 sc in 5 st, 2 sc in 2 st, 1 sc in 8 st, 2 sc in 2 st, 1 sc in 3 st. (24)
- 9-11. 1 sc in each st (24)

12. 1 sc in 4 st, sc2tog, 1 sc in 2 st, sc2tog, 1 sc in 6 st, sc2tog, 1 sc in 2 st, sc2tog, 1 sc in 2 st. (20)
- 13-14. 1 sc in each st (20)
15. 1 sc in 3 st, ch 1 to turn. (3) *Partial row for shaping* Shaping for legs
16. 1 sc in 3 st, ch 1 to turn. (3) *Partial row for shaping*
17. 1 sc in 3 st, (3) *Partial row for shaping* and fasten off with long tail for sewing pieces together.



ARMS (Make 2) (Using 3.5mm hook)
(Using the hole left at the shoulders)

1. P/u 6 sts, 1 sc in each st. (6)
- 2-6. 1 sc in each st. (6)
7. Sc2tog (3 times) (3) and fasten off with long tail for sewing pieces together.

Stuff the arms lightly then stuff the body. Sew the flap to the opposite side of the body, making the leg holes and try to keep the stitches in each leg hole even.


RIGHT LEG (Make 2) (Using 3.5mm hook) (Using the hole left for the leg)

1. P/u 10 sts, 1 sc in each st. (10)
- 2-4. 1 sc in each st. (10)
5. 1 sc in 5 st, ch 1 to turn. (5) *Partial row for shaping*
6. 1 sc in 5 st, ch 1 to turn. (5) *Partial row for shaping*
7. 1 sc in 5 st, join to work and 1 sc in 5 st. (10)
8. Join to partial row, 1 sc in each st. (10)
9. 1 sc in 5 st, sc2tog (twice), 1 sc in st. (8)
10. 1 sc in each st, (8) and fasten off with long tail for sewing pieces together.

LEFT LEG (Make 2) (Using 3.5mm hook) (Using the hole left for the leg)

1. P/u 10 sts, 1 sc in each st. (10)
- 2-4. 1 sc in each st. (10)
5. Ch 1 to turn, 1 sc in 5 st, ch 1 to turn. (5) *Partial row for shaping*
6. 1 sc in 5 st, ch 1 to turn. (5) *Partial row for shaping*
7. 1 sc in 5 st, join to work and 1 sc in 5 st. (10)
8. Join to partial row, 1 sc in each st. (10)
9. 1 sc in 5 st, sc2tog (twice), 1 sc in st. (8)
10. 1 sc in each st, (8) and fasten off with long tail for sewing pieces together.

Assembling the Ghostie:

 **IMPORTANT NOTE:** Make sure the safety eyes are in and the safety backs are secured **before** you stuff and sew the head closed. Keep the placement of the eyes to the middle of the head, as you will need space to embroider the mouth in place later.

To sew hole closed in the head, weave the tail through the stitches around the hole and pull to close the hole. Then sew across the closed spot to keep it closed. Now, you are ready to attach the head to the body of the Ghostie.

Using the tail on the head, sew the head to the shoulders of the Ghostie body. Make sure that you center the head on the shoulders.

Firmly stuff fiberfill into the legs through the opening in the foot, pinch the foot closed horizontally and then, at the toes, over-sew each foot closed and weave in the ends.

With 2 strands of black embroidery floss, stitch an eyebrow over each eye. Then, with 1 strand of CA yarn or a scrap of red yarn, embroider an oval for the mouth of the Ghostie.

With the tail from one of the arms on the Ghostie, stitch it to the mouth of the Ghostie. This makes it look shy and very cute.

(Optional)

TRIANGLE FOR STAND (Using 3.5mm hook) (to help keep eek standing)

1. In CB, Ch 10 and in second ch from hook, 1 sc in each st. (9)
2. Sc2tog, 1 sc in 5 st, sc2tog. (7)
3. 1 sc in each st. (7)
4. Sc2tog, 1 sc in 3 st, sc2tog (5)
5. Sc2tog, 1 sc in st, sc2tog (3)
- 6-7. 1 sc in each st. (3)
8. 2 sc in st, 1 sc in st, 2 sc in st. (5)
9. 2 sc in st, 1 sc in 3 st, 2 sc in st. (7)
10. 1 sc in each st. (7)
11. 2 sc in st, 1 sc in 5 st, 2 sc in st. (9)
12. 1 sc in each st, (9) and fasten off with long tail for sewing pieces together.

Assembling the stand:

Fold in half with small rows in the middle and sew down towards the row of 3 then across to the other side and sew up the other side.

Stuff with fiberfill and sew the open end (the wide end) to the bottom of the second “e” and the bottom of the “k.”

This will give the word “eek” stability so it can easily stand by itself. The Ghostie will also add stability, depending on how and where you sew it.

ASSEMBLING

Attach the first “e” to the second “e” at the middle and then sew the bottom of the first “e” to the side of the second “e.” Then attach the “k” on to the second “e”, sewing it together at the middle of the “e” and the bottom of the “e.”

Attach the Ghostie to between the back of the first “e” and second “e,” sewing it in several places with some CA yarn.

Attach the second arm of the Ghostie to the top of the second “e” and make sure you curve it slightly.



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
